MEDIA ACCESS TO THE SHOW

Pre-approved accredited media personnel must go to the Exhibitor Services Centre (ESC) on their first visit to the Show to collect their Show media accreditation. The ESC is on Murray Rose Avenue, opposite Sydney Olympic Park Station in the RAS Administration Building. Media have the ability to proceed to the head of the line and advise staff they are picking up accreditation. On arrival at the ESC, media personnel must present official media identification or a business card in order to receive Show media accreditation. Show media accreditation must be visible at all times while on site at Sydney Showground.

MEDIA ACCESS TO VENUES

All requests for access to Sydney Showground Stadium must be directed through the Media Centre. All media on the stadium grounds must wear a white coat (provided by the Media Centre) and broadbrimmed hat (provided by the individual). Under no circumstances are media allowed to enter Sydney Showground Stadium during a Grand Parade or the evening entertainment program.

All requests for access to Schmidt Arena, Woodchop Stadium and The Amphitheatre must be directed to the Media Centre.

ACCESS FOR TV CREWS

TV crews requiring onsite vehicle access for live-crosses and filming must advise the Media Centre, **at least 2 hours** in advance where possible, every time they wish to enter Sydney Showground. TV crews arriving at the Showground unannounced will not be admitted by Security. Crew cars and link trucks ONLY will be provided with on-site parking.

MEDIA PARKING

A limited number of media parking spaces are available daily in P1. Exchange your P1 parking ticket for a validated parking pass at the media centre but please note parking is available on a first-in basis.

AROUND SYDNEY SHOWGROUND

Please be considerate of competition judging and pay careful attention to animals and exhibitors when filming, photographing or conducting interviews.

PARKING

Parking at Sydney Olympic Park will be in high demand during the Sydney Royal Easter Show and car parks are likely to reach capacity. You can guarantee a space and save on the daily rate by prebooking your parking ticket. Pre-booked parking through Sydney Olympic Park is \$20 for the whole day.

IMPORTANT TICKET INFORMATION

Show tickets are not available for purchase at Sydney Trains and NSW TrainLink stations or on-board Sydney Olympic Park Major Event Buses or any other transport service. Show tickets are only available online via Ticketmaster. There are no exchanges, refunds or cancellations on purchased Show tickets.

If the 2021 Sydney Royal Easter Show is cancelled, a full-refund policy will apply.

SHUTTLE BUS AND TAXIS

Shuttle buses will run between the northern bus terminal (plaza Show entry) and the P5 car park, and between the Dawn Fraser bus terminal and the P3 and P4 car park. All Showgoers travel for free. Service operates from 9am - 11pm.

GIVING BACK


The Royal Agricultural Society of NSW Foundation (RASF) was created in 2007 with a mission to support the development of sustainable and resilient regional and rural communities across New South Wales by promoting individual and community growth via educational scholarships and community grants.

Many regional and rural communities have been directly affected by the current bushfires and on-going drought which have caused great devastation throughout New South Wales. In a bid to best support these communities, the Royal Agricultural Society of NSW (RAS) is currently focusing on the recovery efforts required once the immediate threat of fire has passed. This year RAS Foundation Community Futures Grants will be directed to specific projects and communities affected by bushfire and drought. The RAS has a number of initiatives in the pipeline to generate funds which will be donated via the RASF to NSW rural communities that have been directly affected by drought and bushfires.

A sell-out success every year following its launch at the Sydney Royal Easter Show in 2014, the Ag Bag is the bag that gives back. Every cent raised by the sale of the Ag Bag goes directly to the RAS Foundation Community Futures Grant program. Celebrating Australian produce, the Ag Bag is jam-packed with product donations from generous Australian owned and made products including SunRice and Carman's. With more than 50,000 items packed into 2,000 Ag Bags onsite at Sydney Showground by volunteers and RAS staff, the bag serves as a brilliant reminder of what we can achieve when we come together for a great cause.

Donating organisations see it as a terrific way to celebrate Australian agriculture and farming whilst helping generate funds for rural community projects. Participants appreciate the exposure of their brand and product and the opportunity to support a grass-roots initiative.

COMPETITION HIGHLIGHTS

Sydney Royal Easter Show competitions are run by the Royal Agricultural Society of NSW to measure and maintain excellence in agriculture. The competitions are judged by experts in their fields to ensure only the 'best of the best' are awarded a prestigious Sydney Royal ribbon.

ALPACA COMPETITION

Bred for their fibre, Alpacas were introduced to Australia at various times throughout the late 1800s but didn't become permanent residents until 1989 and have held a place amongst the competitions at the Sydney Royal Easter Show from 1992.

Assessing breed standards, fibre quality and quantity of fleece produced, judges in the Alpaca & Fleece Competition look at bone structure, balance and proportion and even growth for age. Fleece is judged on density, lustre, character and of course uniformity. When 8-12 April Where Alpaca Pavilion

AVIARY BIRDS

The first Aviary Birds competition was 100 years ago, and it has never flown the coop - just spread its wings to now include 400 birds of all varieties. The Sydney Royal Aviary Bird Show offers classes for African Lovebirds, Parrots, Canaries, Finches and this year's feature breed - the Budgerigar. Also known as the budgie, these birds originated in Australia and are the third most popular pet in the world (after dog and cat).

CAT COMPETITION

The ADVANCE™ Sydney Royal Cat Show is one of the most prestigious feline competitions in Australia, attracting more than 40 breeds, all vying for the ultimate title, Best in Show.

Judges take into account the cat's breed standard, coat, construction and temperament when judging. The purrfectly preened pets can be seen across 5 days at the Show, with Breed Display days on 9 & 10 April, and the Open Champion Competition taking place from 2-4 April. DISTRICT EXHIBITS COMPETITION

A pictorial celebration of Australian agriculture, using produce to create exhibits telling the stories farmers want to share. Displays are entered by five competing regions representing Southern, Northern, Western, Central NSW and South East Queensland and comprise fresh fruit, vegetables, pulses, wool, eggs, beeswax, wine, jams, bacon and more. This year as an unfortunate result of drought, pandemic and other issues the competition aspect has been cancelled and South East Queensland will not be taking part. A People's Choice vote will be held as well as Best Display.

The ADVANCE™ Sydney Royal Dog Show is the leading dog show in Australia, bringing thousands of dogs from across the nation to the Sydney Royal Easter Show. With an impeccable global reputation, this year the ADVANCE™ Sydney Royal Dog Show welcomes international judges from Germany, Brazil, Croatia and Canada to see the best of Australia's canines.

GOAT COMPETITION

First held in 1869, the Sydney Royal Goat Show is the largest and most prestigious in Australia. Attracting over 1000 entries, the competition comprises Boer, Dairy, Angora and Mohair Fleece classes.

The goats compete in their individual breed classes for the highest accolade, Best in Show.

Judges of these competitions may be looking for trueness to type and breed, strong breeding lines or strong yield ability – whether for milk, meat or mohair. **Dates to remember:**

HONEY COMPETITION

A group of about 12 bees will produce 1 teaspoon of honey between them in their lifetime, making every drop of this liquid gold absolutely precious to honey producers and lovers. To see the finest honey in Australia stop by the cabinets of the Sydney Royal National Honey Show, featuring more than 60 classes, including comb, creamed, liquid plus beeswax, candles, mead and pollen. HORSE COMPETITION

The Sydney Royal Horse Show is the largest of its kind attracting over 5,500 entries exhibiting the most prestigious horses in Australia and New Zealand. There's a competitive event every day of the Show with classes including: Breeds, Hacks, Light and Heavy Harness, Showjumping, Campdraft, Rodeo, Pony Club, and Tentpegging. Showjumping is a crowd favourite. And the event to watch will be the Grand Prix Showjumping which offers \$60,000 in prize money and attracts the best competitors Australia-wide.

PIG COMPETITION

The Sydney Royal Pig Show is Australia's best display of pure breed stud pigs is found each year at the Sydney Royal Pig Show, with eight different breeds of pig assessed: Berkshire, Tamworth, Large White, Landrace, Large Black, Hampshire, Duroc and the Wessex Saddleback. Although only 25 pigs landed in Australia with the First Fleet in 1788, believed to be Berkshires, it is now estimated more than 2.2 million pigs grace our farms with the Landrace, Large White and Duroc the most common. Sydney Royal Judges will be looking at conformation with breed standards on 4 April before awarding Best Pig in Show.

POULTRY COMPETITION

The Sydney Royal Poultry Competition welcomes over 2500 entries, including chickens, ducks, turkeys, geese and even guinea fowl. Judging takes place on 3 April with Show visitors then able to see what they think of the judge's decisions with all poultry on display for the remainder of the Show. The top performing poultry take pride of place on Champion Row, with the Grand Champion Bird of Show presented for all to see.

The 2020 feature breed is the Indian Runner, a duck that stands up like a penguin, runs rather than waddle and is one of the most popular duck breeds in Australia.

RABBITS

SHEEP COMPETITION

The Sydney Royal Sheep Show, running across all 12 days of the Show, consists of Fleece, Merino and Meat & Dual Purpose Breeds Competitions. The Meat & Dual Purpose Breeds is a collective for 13 breeds of sheep exhibiting at the Show. Merinos are judged on visual characteristics, fleece type and subjective measurements (fat depth and muscle) in the Objective Measurement Class.

 Fleece looking for the most desirable characteristics of wool? Come and discover what our Judges determine as the best. Weight, uniformity of length and colour are just some of the aspects they look at.

The Australian Livestock & Property Agents (ALPA) Young Auctioneers Competitions held at the Show include the State and National Finals with finalists auctioning prize-winning Sydney Royal Purebred Steers, aiming to get the best price possible for the vendors whilst also impressing the panel of judges. Assessed on clarity, diction, manner and livestock value knowledge, the young auctioneers are also vying for the right to represent Australia in the International Livestock Auctioneers Competition at the Calgary Stampede. YOUNG FARMER CHALLENGE

Life on the land throws up many challenges and a farmer needs to adapt and deal with them all. Our Young Farmers are put to the test in this competition, taking on a series of onfarm challenges with a strong emphasis on safety and technique. Teams of four, aged 18-35, need to impress the judges performing tasks that could include animal handling, firefighting, equipment assembly and even first aid. CHILDREN'S DAY

The 1870s were the start of many traditions for the Royal Agricultural Society of NSW that continue to this day, including two that involve some of our youngest attendees.

On Tuesday 2nd August 1870 we can see the origins of Primary Preview Day, when the Exhibition Committee decreed that "a day be set apart in the third week of the Exhibition for the purpose of enabling all school children to visit the Exhibition". The day was advertised in advance by the Society, and the Launceston Examiner reported that "The school children, to the number of 10,000, were entertained at the Exhibition."

Kids' Day also first occurred in 1870, but its appearance seems to have been a much less organised affair. The Exhibition for 1870 ran from 30th August to the 30th September, but on the 7th September 1870 the minutes show that the Exhibition Committee met and declared that for a Children's Day "Friday 16th be appointed and that the programmes submitted be adopted as amended". The reason for the lateness of the introduction of Children's Day is unknown, but it seems by 1871 the Exhibition Committee was still getting used to the idea as on Friday 25th August, the second last day of the Exhibition, they declared "to reduce the price of admission for children tomorrow".

Check the box that's straw lined, In this nest an "egg" you'll find. Put just one in your bucket and off you scoot,

Next stop is to pick some fruit.

Station 3. Strawberry Patch. Find one juicy red strawberry.

Pick a bright red strawberry from the patch, Ripe and juicy the perfect match. Put it in your bucket and then walk straight ahead,

And make your way into the horse shed. Station 4. Horse Shed. Here we groom our pony's tails.

Clip a lead on your horse before giving him a treat

Then brush out his tail, smooth and neat. Add some extra treats to your bucket, then quick, out the door,

Go to the patch with the vegies that bunnies adore.

Station 5. Vegie Patch. Dig yourself up a carrot or potato.

Potatoes and carrots everywhere. Dig one out of the dirt with care. Hold it up and give it a brush. Better get going, you're in a rush. Station 6. Cow Shed. Milk the cow and

put a bottle in vour bucket.

Take your turn to milk the "cow". Could you do it? Take a bow. Collect a bottle to sell at the market. Does everything still fit in your bucket?

Station 7. Flowers for bees. Collect some pollen thanks to your bee.

Help the honey bee meet the flower, bees need pollen as their super power. Dip him down, he just needs one go And put the pollen in the bucket, don't be slow

Station 8. Pony Barrel Race. Take a ride on a pony.

Ride your "pony" around the track. Go 'round the barrel and then race back. Feed your pony some pretend hay. You have to go, but here he'll stay.

Station 9. Outback Tractor Pull. Drive one lap around the track!

Drive your tractor with your feet. Around the course you can't be beat. Better find a place to park it, It's time to head to the farmers' market.

Station 10. Farmers Market. All your goods need to go in their own baskets.

Take all the things you found on the land, Put them in the bins to give us a hand. Now you get "farm dollars" to spend, When you reach The Shop at the end.

Station 11. The Supermarket. Buy yourself a healthy treat, and wash your farmer's hands before you eat!

SHEEP SECTION

Introducing the South Down as the 2021 Sydney Royal Sheep Meat and Dual Purpose Feature Breed.

South Down were first imported to Australia in 1793, they are heavily muscled with fine textured fleece and have rare breed status.

The feature breed in the Merino competition is Fine Wool – highly valued by the world's fashion houses, it is softer than cashmere and smoother than silk.

AVIARY BIRD SECTION

This year's feature breed – the Budgerigar. Also known as the budgie, these birds originated in Australia and are the third most popular pet in the world (after dogs and cats).
